A LETTER FROM ELISA



Friends,

When we started this journey in November of 2021, we could not have imagined the overwhelming support. For anyone that is new to the R&R family of companies or was not in attendance in Las Vegas, my dad, Rich Francis and his wife Kathie, handed my husband and I a check for \$100,000 and asked that we start a foundation for Autism Research and inclusion. In addition to the \$100,000 he asked that every terminal present would consider donating 54 cents a truckload – and that R&R

Express would match it. WE CAN'T BELIEVE ALL OF THOSE THAT JOINED THE MOVEMENT! From the bottom of our family's hearts, thank you.

At that time the rate of autism was 1 in 54. A few short weeks later, the number increased 23% to 1 in 44. That's a number we won't accept. We've decided to continue to use 54 to show the increasing numbers of those affected by autism. For all of those that joined the per truckload movement, welcome to the "LEX GO! CLUB". Lex who is introduced in this newsletter, is our six-year-old son. I always knew his name would mean something bigger, now it stands for a movement in Autism Research and inclusion. We decided to name the foundation The XEL Foundation. It spells Lex backwards, which also represent the word "EXCEL". The definition of excel is to surpass in accomplishment or achievement.

I promise, as President of The XEL Foundation and with the support of the "LEX GO! Club", our corporate partnerships, and the love from all our family and friends, that we will XEL any expectations and we will make a movement for all of those with Autism and the families that love them.

The learning, thinking, and problem-solving abilities of people with ASD can range from gifted to severely challenged.
